
























Unapologetically Me! Ms Sneha Bhagat, Faculty English Department








Interview of Justice Pankaj Bhatia in conversation with Swarit Varshney, XI-A

Swarit: After class X, today's students go to coaching centers to prepare for exams like JEE, NEET, CLAT, etc. What do you think if a student stays after X and continues to study in class XI-XII in boarding schools then can he/she prepare for these exams?

Justice Pankaj Bhatia: Of course, it can happen. Even studying in class XI-XII a student can crack these examinations because he has to study for it and take the same exam with the same question paper whether he stays in a boarding school or any other school. But the focus and the balance that he needs for the preparations of these competitive exams are developed only while staying in a boarding school with a jam-packed schedule of various activities. Let's take an example, suppose a student is indulged in different activities like sports, house activities, academics, etc., has other tasks to do, and is given a schedule in which there is a specific time for everything. Then it gets difficult for him to manage all these things. For this, he needs utmost focus and balance which he can't learn in every school and is only possible in boarding schools. But those in day schools who already know how to focus on one thing and balance it out, get distracted by personal problems and are inevitably to not study because of lack of focus which in contrast to boarding schools doesn't happen. There isn't a single facility that boarding schools don't offer compared to other schools. One thing that is, learning how to maintain your work, also is a part and parcel of these schools.

Swarit: How has Review helped you during your journey in The Scindia School?

Justice Pankaj Bhatia: Review has just

taught me how to express my thoughts into words. I used to see like that if a school prefect can write his thoughts so beautifully, then why can't I write? This was the challenge that I took upon myself. In our times, we had the letter writing. Letter writing was also nothing but expressing your thoughts into words. Now unfortunately letter writing is not there, therefore, Review is one of the major things that can help anybody to express their thoughts into words and this is the only thing that will help you in your future journey. The one who will be able to express and present his thoughts in a better manner will eventually succeed and those who fail to express their thoughts will be in trouble.

Swarit: The Astachal is an important part of our school that no other school has. The students come here and introspect. So, after leaving the school, do you still continue with the practice of Astachal?

Justice Pankaj Bhatia: Even today, what we used to do in the evening, now I do it daily in the morning. Every day I wake up at 4:30 or 5 a.m., and the first thing to start my day is to meditate and pray which I have continued to do till date. This has given me peace and led to my road to success.

Swarit: Talking about the Indian education system, in the past we had the Gurukul system of teaching and in the modern era, we now have transitioned to classroom-based teaching. What are your views on going back to the Gurukul system of teaching from the class-based teaching?

Justice Pankaj Bhatia : The change



from the classroom to the Gurukul system of teaching should happen, which is true. But now the question arises, would we be able to change? It has its challenges, because we're not in isolation, we're a society that is working altogether. So we will have to behave according to what will be the norms of society. We cannot live in isolation and say that we will move this way and the rest of the world will move in a different way. This should happen, it is a fact, that the Gurukul system must come. However, it is not possible to evaluate until it comes across India or in most places.
